

The Integrity Pact is a tool developed in the 1990's by Transparency International to help governments, businesses and civil society to fight corruption in the field of public contracting. IP is intended to make public procurement transparent by binding both parties to ethical conduct. It consists of a process that includes an agreement between a government or a government department and all bidders for a public contract. It contains rights and obligations to the effect that neither side will: pay, offer, demand or accept bribes; collude with competitors to obtain the contract; or engage in such abuses while carrying out the contract. The IP also introduces a monitoring system that provides for independent oversight and accountability.

CCL has signed an MOU with M/s. Transparency International India on 11-8-08 for implementation of IP Programme. The IPP was made operational in CCL after the adoption of above said MOU in CCL Board at its 350th meeting held on 23.08.2008. Out of a panel of 15 Independent External Monitors approved by CVC, two names have been selected by CMD, CCL, as IEMs for CCL who are Mr. M.M. Buch, IAS (Retired) and Mr. Yogesh Chandra. At present the IP Program has been implemented in all the Contracts which require the approval of CMD, CCL or CCL Board. CCL has also appointed CGM (CMC) & CGM (MM) as Nodal Officers for implementation of Integrity Pact Programme.
